In the 1970's I taught sociology and politics to undergraduate and graduate students at British universities for five years. From 1983 to 1988 I had many engagements in the US to lecture on feminism, militarism, and ecology in a variety of curricular settings including law, peace studies, philosophy, political science, religion, sociology, and women's studies.

Curriculum/Program Development

In 2013, I developed a month-long intensive course, "Cultures of War", for St. Mary's College January Term, later reworked as "Cultures of War and Peace"; also a semester-long course on "Gender and Work" for Sonoma State University (taught Spring 2014).

For the University of Oregon I developed and updated an upper-level undergrad/grad course: "Women and Militarism, War and Peace" (2003, 2009-10) and updated a course that links feminism and environmental justice (2009-10, 2011).

At Hamilton College, I developed two new courses: "Redefining Security" and "Living in Place: Analysis and Strategies for Environmental Citizenship".

At Antioch, I developed core Women's Studies courses: "Feminist Theories", "Global Feminisms", "Women and Work", and two elective courses: "Gay/Lesbian Perspectives", and "Gender, Race, Class, and Environmental Movements". I coordinated the Women's Studies Board of Study that oversaw the major. I also participated in the development of an Environmental Studies major.

At Colorado College, I developed sociology courses: "Feminist Perspectives on Leadership"; and "Gendered Cities: Women and the Man-made Environment". I introduced a new women's studies course on "Ecofeminism", with contributions from colleagues in physical and natural sciences (botany, geology, and physics).

At Rutgers, I participated in a New Jersey Department of Higher Education-funded project to revise the Women's Studies introductory course to make it more multicultural. Informally I also worked on a Peace Studies curriculum.
